The FNISPAQ is an Aboriginal organization established about 20 years ago. Its mission is to contribute to the well-being and balance of the lives of Aboriginal people of Quebec through activities such as community awareness, prevention, and education. The Association brings together front-line workers often isolated and dealing with complex community realities who work in the development of psychosocial interventions made accessible in the language and the cultural context of each community.



New Pathways Foundation

Founded by First Nations for the benefit of their youth in 2010, the New Pathways Foundation works for the future and the well-being of First Nations youth in Quebec. Its mission is to pursue a youth that is fulfilled and confident in a better future thanks to a strong identity. Whether they are on or off community, the New Pathways Foundation develops concrete, positive experiences that reflect the image of First Nations youth.

Puamun Meshkenu (Path of a Thousand Dreams) is an organization with the aim of developing the full potential of Indigenous people by promoting the concepts of holistic health, student retention and Aboriginal identity. The organization, founded by Dr. Stanley Vollant in 2016, initiates projects that have fundamental impacts on many First Nations youths and structuring effects across Aboriginal communities in Quebec.



Breakfast Club of Canada

Since 1994, Breakfast Club of Canada has been nourishing children's potential by ensuring they have access to a healthy breakfast at school, in a welcoming and inclusive environment. The Club is constantly on the lookout for sustainable ways of reaching out to more children in Indigenous communities in order to support youth, adult and community empowerment by opting for culturally and nutritionally appropriate food. The Club supports innovative, holistic approaches. They also track, record and share progress, challenges and successes as well as engage the philanthropic community.

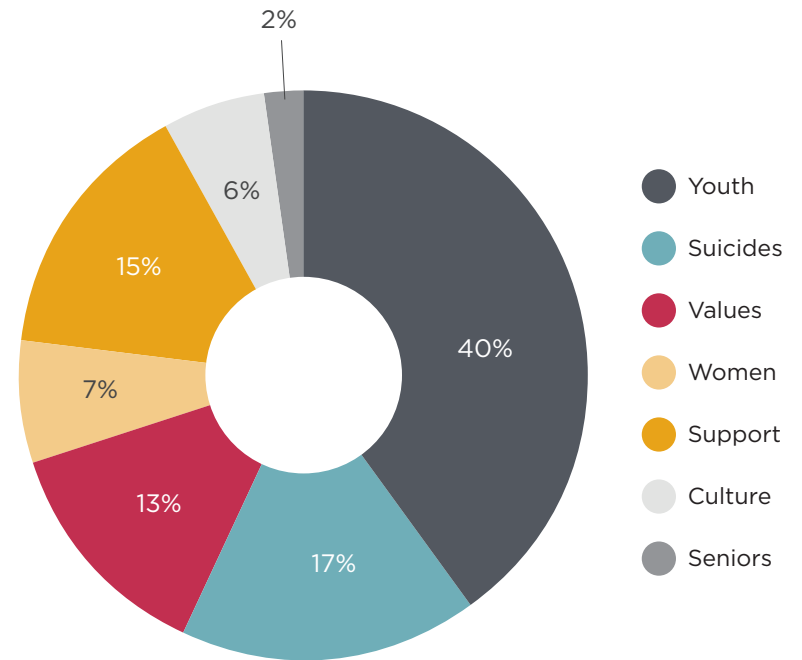
