





#### FIRST NATIONS AND INUIT SUICIDE PREVENTION ASSOCIATION OF QUEBEC AND LABRADOR (FNISPAQ)

The FNISPAQ is an Indigenous organization established about 20 years ago. Its mission is to contribute to the well-being and balance of the lives of Indigenous people of Quebec through community activities such as awareness, prevention, and education. The Association brings together front-line workers often isolated and dealing with complex community realities and works to ensure access to psychosocial interventions in the language and the cultural context of each community.







#### BREAKFAST CLUB OF CANADA

Since 1994, Breakfast Club of Canada has been nourishing children's potential by ensuring they have access to a healthy breakfast at school in a welcoming and inclusive environment. The Club is constantly on the lookout for sustainable ways of reaching out to more children in Indigenous communities to support community empowerment by opting for culturally and nutritionally appropriate food. The Club supports innovative, holistic approaches. They also track, record, and share progress, challenges and successes as well as engage the philanthropic community.







Founded in 2010 by First Nations for the benefit of their youth, the New Pathways Foundation works for the future and the well-being of First Nations youth in Quebec. The Foundations' mission is to help young people reach their full potential and be confident in a better future through a strong identity. Whether on or off the community, the New Pathways Foundation creates positive handson experiences that reflect First Nations' youth.








#### PUAMUN MESHKENU
